Discussion Questions

- **Read Psalm 91:1.** P. Matt spoke a lot about making the secret place your dwelling place. What does he mean by that?
- “Is the secret place your home, or is it like a hotel you check into every now and then?” Where do you fall on this scale? Does God just have visitation rights or does He have full custody of your soul?
- Can you dwell in the secret place when you are at work or school or is that solely when you are alone with God? What does dwelling in the secret place that look like on an everyday basis and how does that carry into your daily routine?
- “Knowing God is an experience, an encounter, intimate contact with God.” If this is true, then how do we balance the tension of knowing God and not exclusively seeking after the emotional feelings that may come with knowing God?
- We all know in our minds that we should find our worth in God, but how do we *put that into practice*? If you find your worth and value in what others say, what are the steps you need to take to replace their voices and opinions with the voice, opinion, and affirmation of Jesus?
- **Read 2nd Corinthians 4:18.** How do we adjust our paradigm to where the unseen reality of the Kingdom becomes the reality we adhere to?
- How can we ensure that we don't let sin (and the guilt from committing sin) keep us from entering into God's presence? If applicable, share some verses that back up what you think.
- **Read Psalm 91:14-16.** What truths do these verses reinforce? Which is the hardest for you to believe? Why do you think that is?
