



Psalm 106

Main Scripture: Psalm 106:1-21

Additional Scriptures: Romans 1:18-23, Acts 17:25, Ephesians 5:20

Discussion Questions

- “Give Thanks!” This week’s sermon is a concrete application of last week’s sermon (a.k.a. “Forget Not Part 2”). **Read Psalm 106:1.** P. Mike mentioned that gratitude is an important requirement to being a disciple of Jesus. What does he mean by that?
- **Read Psalm 106:6-22** – This is a historical Psalm of Israel and their forgetfulness, yet it is not just the story of Israel, but the story of humanity. Now **Read Romans 1:18-23** that talks about the Gentiles. In what ways are people today similar to the Jews and Gentiles in these passages?
- **Romans 1:21** says “For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened.” P. Mike mentioned that “Ingratitude turns glorious things into detestable things.” If this is true, how can we posture ourselves to avoid ingratitude?
- Desires turn into expectations which turn into entitlements. “When you feel entitled to something, you are not thankful.” What are some things that you feel entitled to? (i.e. liberty, salary, degree, etc.)
- **Read Psalm 106:1-5.** Thankfulness makes ordinary things glorious. When you give thanks for what you’ve got, little things become so glorious. Now **Read Acts 17:25.** With the perspective of knowing that everything is a gift from God, What are the little things that you are thankful for?
- **Read Ephesians 5:20.** – Paul advises the Ephesians to give thanks always and for everything. Giving thanks is not just when life is good, but because God is good. Challenge yourself daily to 5 solid minutes of giving thanks for things in your life (i.e. the moment you wake up, the food you eat/prepare, the job you go to, etc.)
