

Morph - Part 2

Main Scripture: Matthew 28:17-18

Additional Scriptures: Luke 21:16, Luke 21:18; Matthew 25:38-40; Luke 19:17; Ephesians 1:19

Discussion Questions

- Pastor Mike said that some of us just need to learn that “God is God!” So when He tells us to move, we need to learn to do so without having to ask “WHY?” Why (no pun intended) is it often so hard for us to move without first stopping to ask “Why?”
 - “When you need to know why before you move, what you want isn’t submission, but rather control. What did Pastor Mike mean by this?”
- In a relationship, you will often disagree, but with God, He is always right. Is this hard for you to accept and acknowledge even when you disagree, or don’t understand what God is doing?
- When speaking of where Jesus will often take us, Pastor Mike said, “There’s something about taking things to the edge, and crossing the boundary from the safe to the risky!” What did he mean by this? What was he trying to get at?
 - “There are ways in which you will see Jesus on the edge, that you would have never seen Him otherwise!” Do you agree with this?
- **Read Luke 21:16.** If you make the decision to follow Jesus, this is something that can literally cost you your life. Is this a fact that you can grasp? Why or why not?
 - Would you be willing to lose your life for the gospel if it came down to it?
 - Jesus said, “I send you out as sheep among wolves.” What did Jesus mean by this? And how does it apply to us today?
- **Read Luke 21:18.** This is a bit of a paradox, as opposed to Luke 21:16. How do we reconcile the fact that some will die for the gospel, while others will be unharmed, even in the midst of the chaos.
- **Read Matthew 25:38-40.** Pastor Mike said, “There is something about the way you discover Jesus in the lost and least of these, that you will never find anywhere else?” What was meant by this? And do you agree?
- **Read Matthew 28:19.** Why do we so often treat the command to “go” as if it is a calling for some, when Jesus clearly gave a command for all of us?
 - Pastor Mike said there are 3 options: to go, to send, or to disobey. What does this mean for us as Christians? And what’s the next step?
