Main Scripture: Mark 5:1-20

Hearing: Discussion Questions

- “Jesus is always the one who reaches out to those that no one else wants to reach out to and He calls us to do the same.” Who in your life is a modern day outcast that the Lord is calling you to be with and minister to? (This could be someone in your class, family, work, etc.)
- Jesus takes trash and transforms it into treasure. Why is knowing our identity in Christ such an important aspect of our faith?
 - What *is* our identity in Christ? Cite some Scriptures to back this up.
- “Getting comfortable is the lure that satan uses to completely immobilize disciples and get them to ride pine in the Kingdom for the rest of their life.” If you are honest, where have you gotten comfortable in your walk with Jesus?
 - Where has your small group gotten comfortable?
 - Are you actively reaching out or has small group started to turn inwards?
- We are transformed so that we can be agents of transformation. What does it mean to be transformed?
 - What does it look like to be an agent of transformation?
 - How does this affect the following areas of your life:
 - Family, friends, Sunday morning, work, school, running errands, etc.?
- Why do so many people think that following Jesus simply equates to sin management? Where in your walk have you gone from actively engaging in Kingdom activity to merely being on the defense and just trying to stop sinning?
 - How do you go from defensive to offensive Christianity?
- We defeat sin by tapping into our God given mission of making disciples. So how are you making disciples?
 - Who are you called to? If you are called to be one and make one, who is it that you are called to disciple?
